We want our parents/guardians to talk to their children about substance abuse. Research shows that children listen to their parents. Start talking before it's too late.

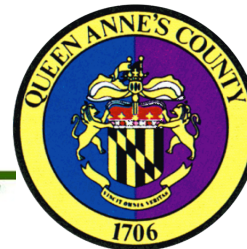
